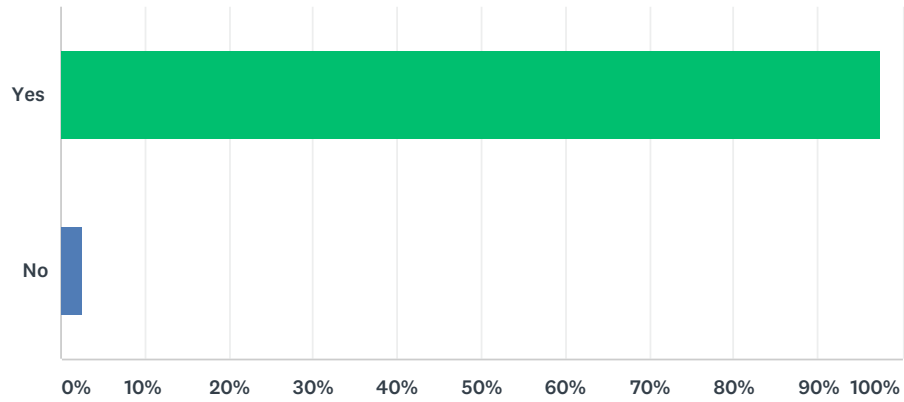


Q1 Do you or your family own or rent a waterfront property?

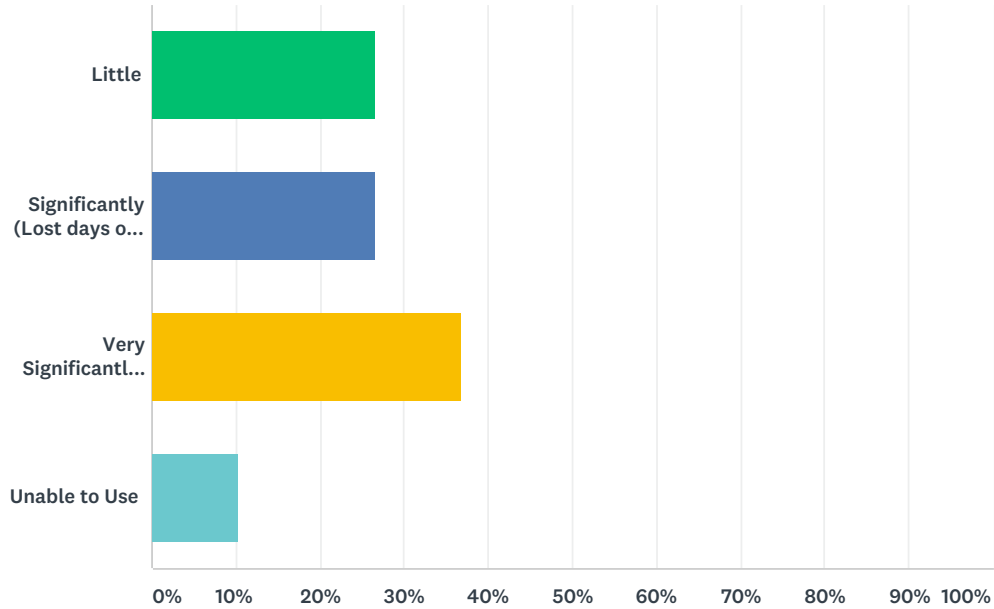

Q2 Has the current high water crisis significantly and adversely changed the way or frequency you use the River and/or your Property in 2017 & 2019?

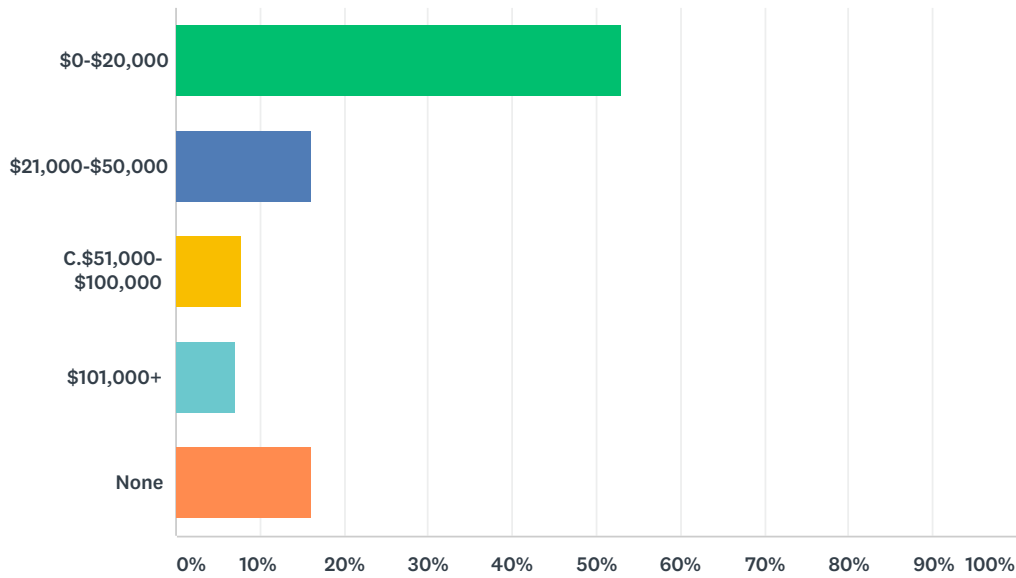

Q3 If there are financial ramifications related to the flooding of your property, how much do you think it will cost to fix?

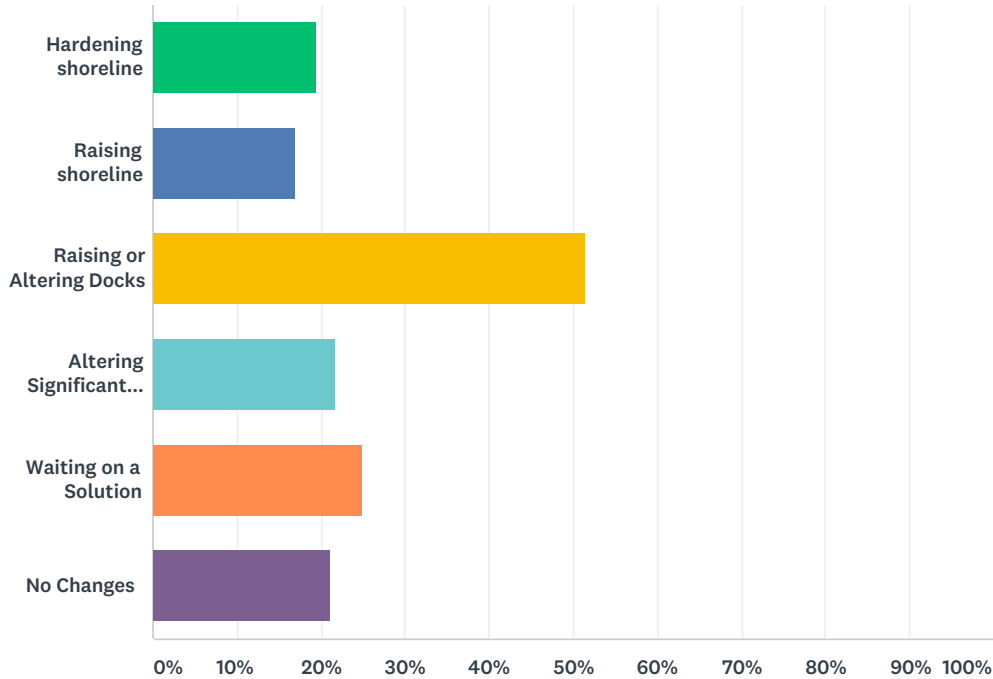

Q4 Are you considering hardening or raising your shoreline, docks or other measures to mitigate future flooding, or waiting until problems are solved? (Check all that apply)

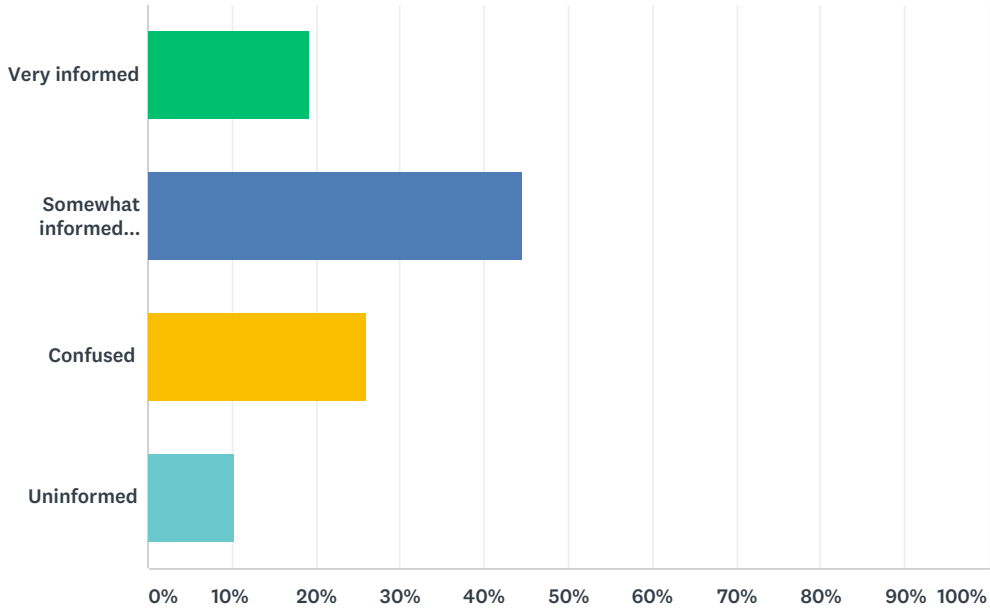

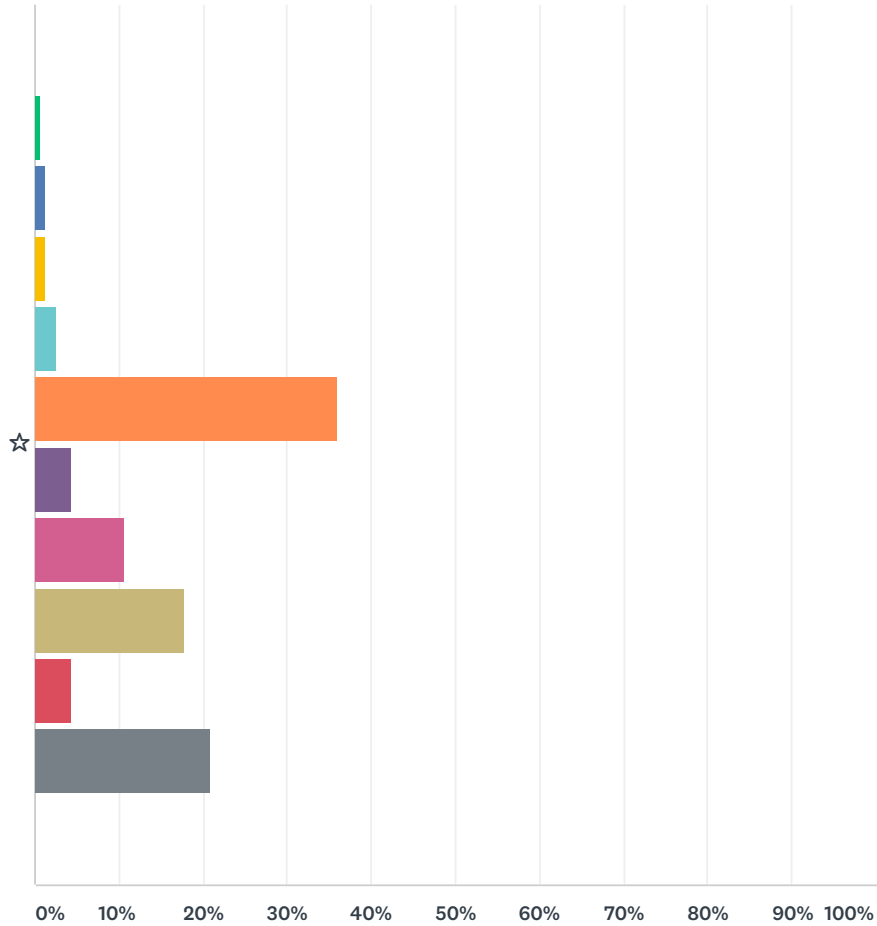

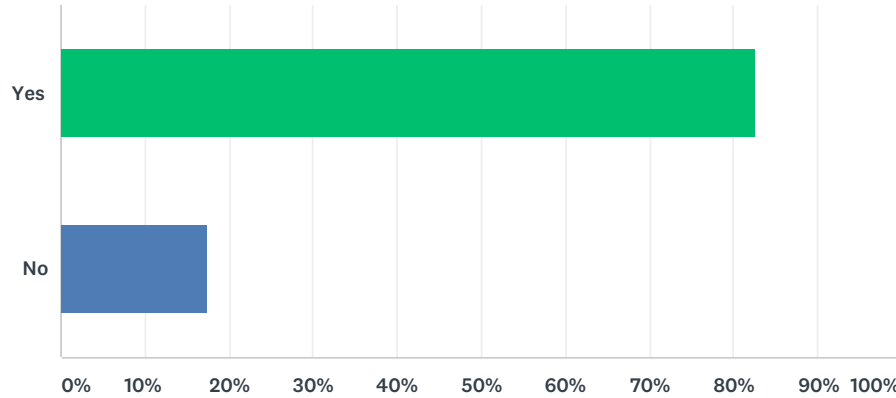

Q7 Do you believe that property taxes should be adjusted to reflect the depleting asset value of waterfront property due to damage and access problems caused by extreme high water levels?

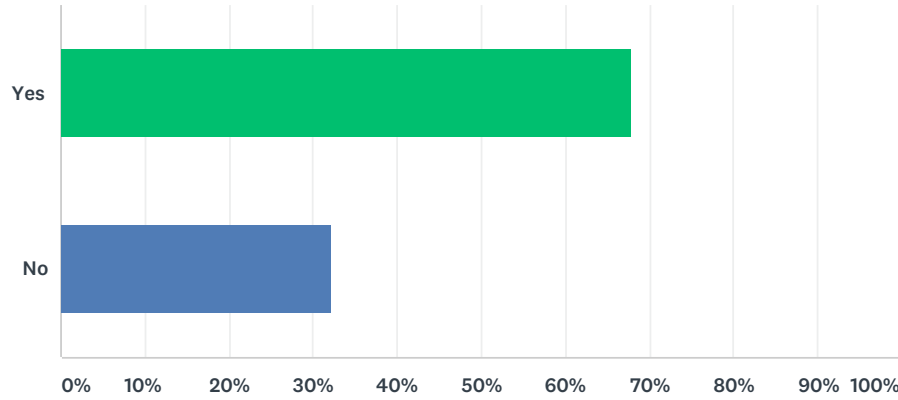

Q8 Do you believe the International Joint Commission (IJC) should provide financial compensation for those who can still harden their shorelines or structures to accommodate their predicted future flooding?

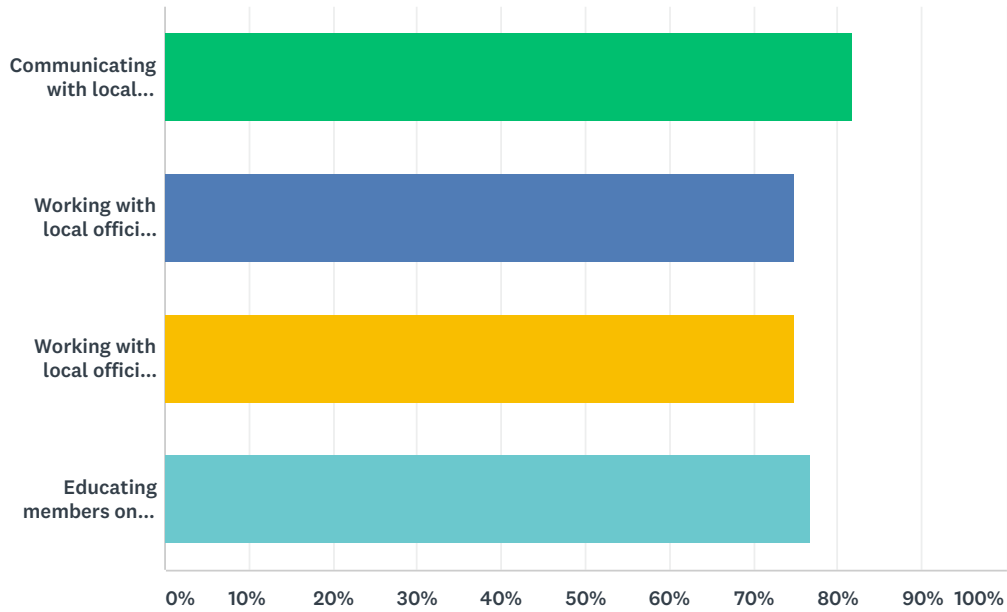

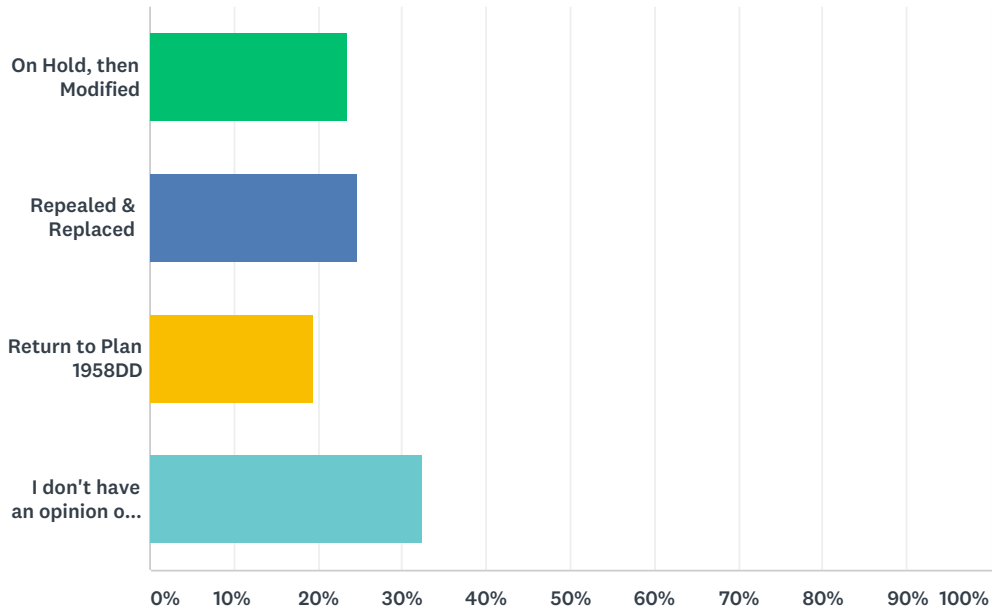
