**Bostwick Island - Admiralty Group

This historic Bostwick Island cottage was established by JR and Rose Street between 1905 and 1907, and has remained in their family since it was built. The cottage has water views on three sides, a large screened-in veranda and a naturally occurring beach. Current owners, Chris Street (4th generation) and Gabrielle Kurlander, restored the cottage in 2019 maintaining many of its original features.

**Sagastweka Island - Admiralty Group

This vintage cottage was built in 1886 by the Stanley family from Montreal. We purchased the cottage in 2010 from the Wright family who lived in the U.S. and repatriated the cottage. It has been renovated with some modern features, i.e kitchen and new bathrooms. From our screened-in porch, we can see down Wanderer's Channel to the windmills on Wolfe Island. The boathouse was added in 2016. Sagastaweka means 'house of sunlight'.



**Bluff Island - Admiralty Group

Bluff Island is a lead island in the SLR Admiralty Group facing 40 acre shoals to the south and Bostwick Island to the west. Cottage and Boat Port have green roofs and white structure. Approach from west opposite Half Moon Bay on Bostwick Island.

**La Vignette Island - Admiralty Group

La Vignette was built at the turn of the century by Architect Frank Lent. It was his personal summer retreat. He is renowned for a number of signature cottage designs in the area and for the Gananoque Clock tower. La Vignette's iconic bridge is a breakwater to the boathouse behind and connects the two small islands. A steam whistle on the bridge signals to passing tour boats in a decades long tradition.





**Juniper Island - Admiralty Group**

In the early 1900s, our great grandparents visited their friends, the Kipp family on their island, Leek. They were so taken with the area that when Juniper Island came up for sale, they bought it in 1913. In an old photo album, you can see their first meals on the island when they feasted in the woods. Juniper is steeped in our family history and we feel like stewards, preserving the island and its legends for future generations.
